

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- 1 Particular attention must be taken to comply with SI 2002 No. 2665 Electricity Safety, Quality and Continuity Regulations 2002 (as amended).
- Electricity at Work Regulations 1989, Regulation 4 and Memorandum of guidance (HSR 25) published by the HSE.
- 9 Medical locations shall have their isolating transformer equipment inspected and tested for functionality as well as alarms etc.; every third year the output leakage current of the LT isolating equipment shall be measured.

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
